- Race, ethnic origin, marital status, age, color, and religious, philosophical or political
- > Health, education, genetic or sexual life, or to any proceeding for any offense committed or alleged to have been committed by such person, the disposal of such proceedings, or the sentence of any court in such proceedings;
- Government-issued identification including social security numbers, previous or current health records, licenses or its denials, suspension or revocation, and tax returns

In the event that sensitive personal information is involved, kindly inform AC's Data Privacy Office so that your previously accomplished PIA may be reviewed and/or clarified.

Reasonable Expectations
Questions to consider:
Does AC have an existing relationship with the individual? What is the nature of the relationship and how have you used data in the past?
Did you collect the data directly from the individuals? What did you tell them at the time?
Does the data subject reasonably expect the organization to process the data for the purposes identified?
If you obtained the data from a third party, what did they tell the individuals about reuse by third parties for other purposes and does this cover you?
How long ago did you collect the data?
Are there any changes in technology or context since then or anything new or innovative you hope to do with the data that could affect expectations?
Do you have any evidence about expectations – e.g. from market research, focus groups or other forms of consultation?
Are there any other factors in the particular circumstances that mean they would or would not expect the processing?
Additional Note:
Organizations should avoid using legitimate interests as basis if it will use personal data in ways individuals do not understand and would not reasonably expect, or in cases where some individuals would possibly object when explained to them.

Likelihood pertains to the scope and mode of processing personal data and the potential for the data to be unlawfully disclosed or exploited. Likelihood is affected by the use of privacy enhancing technologies (PETs) such as access controls, encryption, and data-masking techniques.
